US-Bangla launches flights to its 11th int'l route Sharjah

Dhaka: US-Bangla Airlines has launched flights to Sharjah in the United Arab Emirates, one of the popular destinations in the Middle East. The flight from Dhaka to Sharjah officially started operating as the 11th international route from Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport, Dhaka at 9:00 pm on January 30.

AKM Junaid, Director-Customer Service, Capt Nur Uddin Al Masood Director Flight Operations of US-Bangla Airlines, Zulfigar Ali, General Manager-Operations, Emran Ahmed, General Manager-Customer Service, AK Azad, General Manager-Customers Service and other high officials were present at the inaugural ceremony of the maiden Dhaka-Sharjah flight of US-Bangla.

Initially, US-Bangla is going to operate flights on Dhaka-Sharjah route six days a week.

US-Bangla's flight will leave Dhaka at 9:00 pm every day of the week except Saturday and will reach Sharjah directly at 12:30 pm local time. On the other hand, it will leave Sharjah for Dhaka on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 1:30 am local time and land in Dhaka at 8:00 am. It will also leave Sharjah for Chattogram at 1:30 am on Monday, Thursday and Saturday and land in Chattogram at 8:00 am.

US-Bangla starts flights on Sharjah route with 164 seater Boeing 737-800 aircraft. The airline's fleet currently has a total of 16 aircraft, including six Boeing 737-800s and seven brand new ATR 72-600s.

US-Bangla Airlines currently operates flights to Dubai, Muscat, Doha, Kuala Lumpur, Singapore, Chennai, Kolkata, India and Guangzhou.

Flight operations on the Bangkok route have been temporarily suspended due to the Corona pandemic.

As part of its future plans, US-Bangla Airlines plans to launch flights to Colombo, Delhi, Jeddah, Riyadh, Medina and Dammam soon.

US-Bangla Airlines also flies to all destinations across the country. The airline is operating cross-country long haul domestic routes too.
