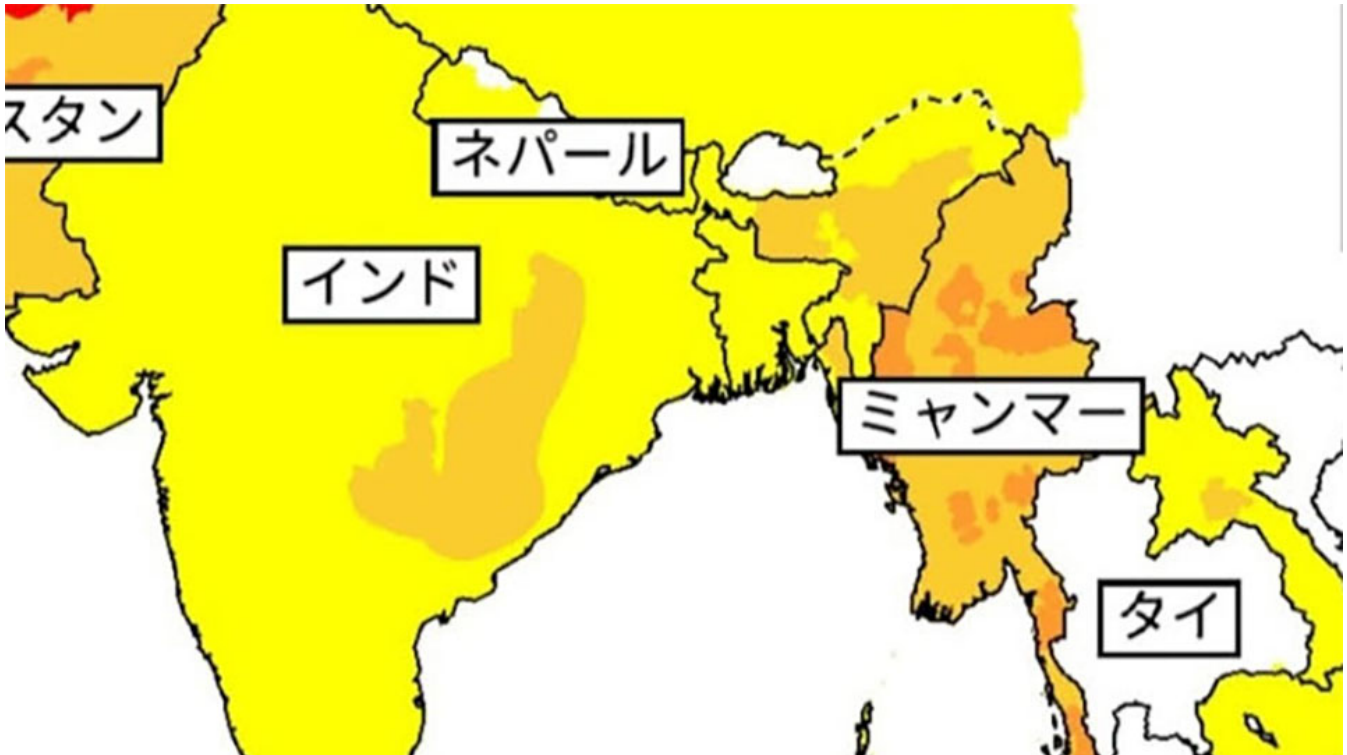


## Japan eases travel alert for visiting Bangladesh to Level One

Dhaka: The Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs announced a significant update to its travel advisory for visiting Bangladesh on December 27. With the latest downgrade to Level One, Japanese travelers are now encouraged to approach visits to Bangladesh with cautious optimism.

The change reflects a growing sense of safety and stability in the country, paving the way for renewed travel and exploration, said reports.

Earlier in July and August, Japan issued a Level Two travel alert for Bangladesh, advising citizens to avoid non-essential travel due to security concerns. The alert was part of Japan's four-tier system, which ranges from Level 1, urging general caution, to Level 4, warning against all travel.

The development acknowledges Bangladesh's efforts to create a safer environment for residents and visitors alike. Strengthened security measures, proactive policing, and community initiatives have collectively contributed to the positive shift, mentioned reports, adding, the move comes as a recognition of progress made by the country to ensure a more welcoming atmosphere for international travelers.
