

## **Akasa Air to launch regular flights between SA and India from June 8**

**Mumbai: Saudi Arabia's General Authority of Civil Aviation (GACA) has recently given the green light to Akasa Air, a carrier based in India, for the initiation of regular flight services between Saudi Arabia and India.**

This development marks a significant step towards enhancing air connectivity between the two countries, aiming to integrate Saudi Arabia more closely with the global aviation network.
