## Dubai plans new luxury island near Burj Al Arab

In parallel, Dubai continues its sustainability journey with the redevelopment of the Ras Al Khor Wildlife Sanctuary, announced earlier this year.

With a budget of Dh650 million, the sanctuary's facelift is being rolled out in two phases—the first set for completion by the end of 2026 at Dh100 million.
