

Emirates resumes passenger services to Moscow from September 11

- A Monitor Desk Report

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Dubai: Emirates will re-start passenger services to Moscow Domodedovo Airport (DME) with two flights a week, starting 11 September. Flights to Moscow will operate on Fridays and Saturdays. The resumption of flights to Moscow will take the airline's expanding network in Europe to 26 cities. The addition of Moscow will take Emirates' global network to 85 cities in September.

The flights to Moscow will operate with the Emirates Boeing 777-300ER and can be booked on [emirates.com](https://www.emirates.com) or via travel agents. Travelers can also enjoy enhanced connectivity via Emirates' codeshare partner in Russia, S7 Airlines – providing greater access to a range of regional destinations.

Customers can stop over or travel to Dubai as the city has re-opened for international business and leisure visitors. Ensuring the safety of travellers, visitors, and the community, COVID-19 PCR tests are mandatory for all inbound and transit passengers arriving to Dubai (and the UAE). Dubai was one of the world's first cities to obtain SafeTravels stamp from the World Travel and Tourism Council

(WTTC). In Bangladesh Emirates passengers can obtain Dubai visa at the airline's office counter in Dhaka.

Emirates' booking policies offer customers flexibility and confidence to plan their travel. Customers who purchase an Emirates ticket by 30 September 2020 for travel on or before 30 November 2020, can enjoy generous rebooking terms and options.

Emirates has committed to cover COVID-19 related medical expenses, free of cost, should they be diagnosed with COVID-19 during their travel. This cover is applicable for customers flying on Emirates until 31 October 2020 (first flight to be completed on or before 31 October 2020), and is valid for 31 days from the moment they fly the first sector of their journey.

Emirates has implemented a comprehensive set of measures at every step of the customer journey to ensure the safety of its customers and employees on the ground and in the air, including the distribution of complimentary hygiene kits containing masks, gloves, hand sanitiser and antibacterial wipes to all customers.

Emirates now operates 7 weekly flights from Dhaka and via Dubai offers connections to nearly 80 cities worldwide
