

Fly Jinnah expands Saudi operations

Islamabad: Fly Jinnah, Pakistan's low-cost carrier, has announced an increase in flight frequencies to three key destinations in Saudi Arabia—Dammam, Riyadh, and Jeddah—directly from Lahore, starting December 6, 2024.

Flights to Dammam will increase from two to three weekly, while services to Jeddah will operate daily, up from four weekly flights.
