Dhaka: National Hotel and Tourism training institute of Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation is participating for the 6th time in this World's largest Culinary Competition among young chefs. The 8th International Virtual IIM Young Chef Olympiad 2022 is taking place from January 30 to February 5 virtually due to the pandemic.

The International Hospitality Council, London in association with International Institute of Hotel Management, one of the world's largest Hotel School Chain, pioneered the Young Chef Olympiad with a vision to give young student chefs from around the world a platform to showcase their skills and compete at the global level.
