

Turkish airlines launches flights to Seville

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Dhaka: Turkish Airlines, the national flag carrier of Türkiye, has expanded its Southern Europe network by adding Seville as its sixth destination in Spain, following Madrid, Barcelona, Valencia, Malaga, and Bilbao.

In a press release issued by the airline, Turkish Airlines said the new route, which launched on September 17, enhances its global connectivity and underscores its commitment to expanding access to prominent tourism destinations across Europe.

Described as the "heart of Andalusia," Seville is renowned for its historical significance, architectural heritage, and Andalusian cuisine.

The new route reflects the airline's strategy to tap into strong cultural and tourism demand in the region.

The airline will operate daily flights between Istanbul Airport (IST) and

Seville Airport (SVQ), with services split across two flight schedules:

Flights TK 1297 / TK 1298 will operate on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays, departing Istanbul at 06:55 and returning from Seville at 11:45.

Flights TK 1299 / TK 1300 will operate on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Sundays, departing Istanbul at 13:50 and returning from Seville at 18:40.

To mark the launch, Turkish Airlines has introduced special promotional fares valid for bookings made until September 30, 2025.

Passengers can purchase return tickets from Istanbul to Seville starting at USD 180, and from Seville to Istanbul starting at EUR 148, for travel until March 15, 2026.

Speaking on the launch, Ahmet Bolat, Chairman of the Board and the Executive Committee at Turkish Airlines, said, "As Turkish Airlines, we are delighted to offer our passengers a new travel option with the launch of our Seville flights.

We believe these flights to one of Spain's oldest settlements will bring new opportunities for both tourism and business, while further growing trade and tourism capacity across the region.

Through our uniquely located home base, Istanbul, we will continue bridging cultures and continents around the world."

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
