UAE approves multiple-entry tourist visas

Dhaka: The UAE Cabinet has approved a proposal for multiple-entry tourist visas for all nationalities. The move follows the tourism revival efforts of the authorities in the United Arab Emirates.

Reportedly, the cabinet also approved 'Virtual Visa', which is a new visa category that will enable people to work online from Dubai irrespective of where their office is located.

The multiple entry tourist visa will come with a validity of 90 days, which will restrict re-entry after the expiry of approved three months validity. This new proposal will enable people to enter and exit the Emirates multiple times.

The new rule is in line with several initiatives that have recently been approved by the Cabinet during a meeting that was chaired by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, UAE Vice President and Prime Minister, and the Ruler of Dubai.

The move also aims to position UAE as an ideal tourist and business

destination.

Also, to attract expertise and talents from across the world, the UAE Cabinet approved a new Remote Work Visas scheme which will enable remote workers from all over the world to work remotely from the UAE. It will be a one-year visa that will allow foreigners to enter the UAE under self-sponsorship, apart from working in line with the terms and conditions that will come along with the visa.
