

Rajshahi: scorching summers, timeless stories, mango magic

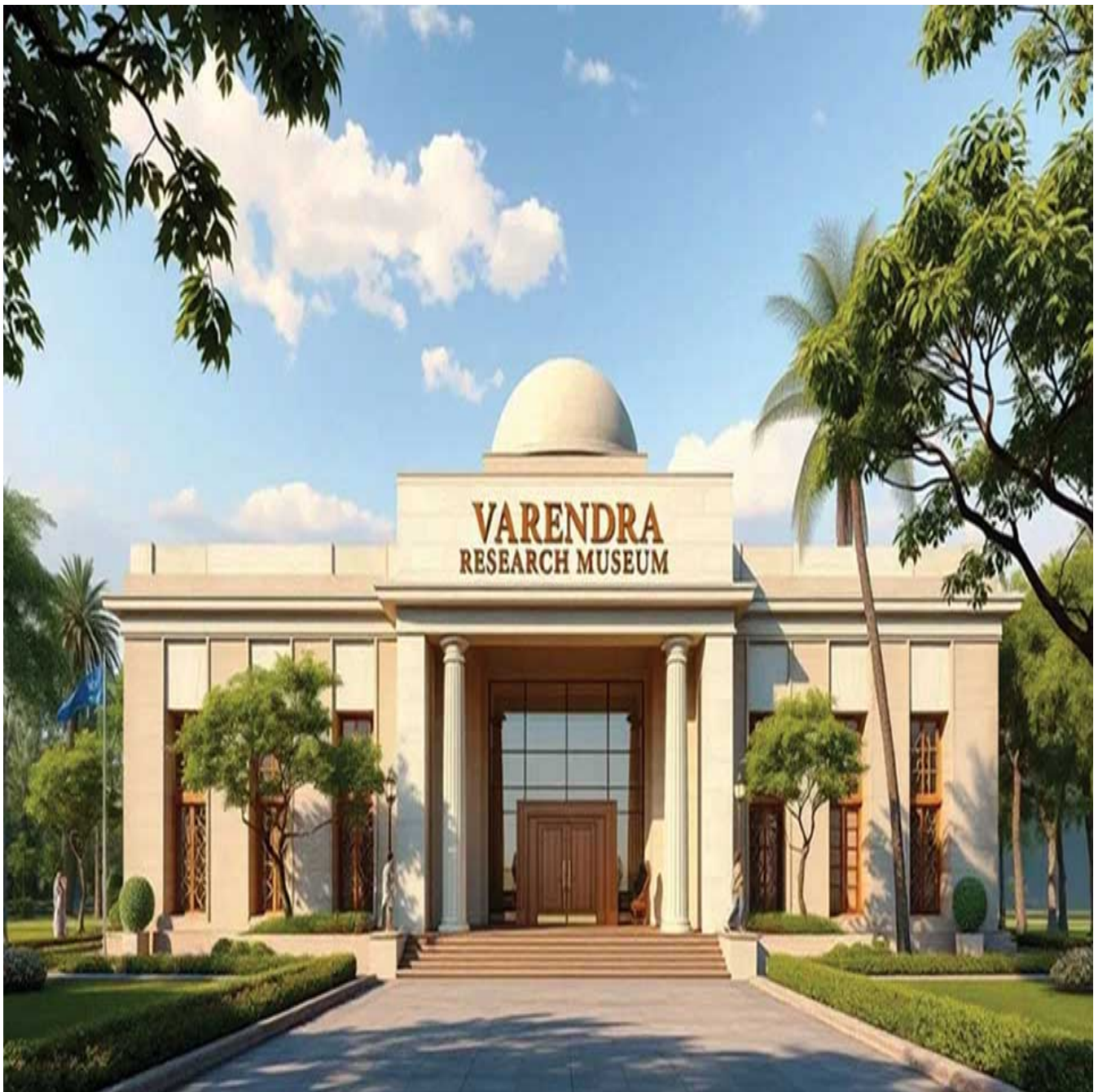

Varendra museum

Officially christened the Varendra Research Museum, this venerable institution holds the title of Bangladesh's oldest museum. Curated under the stewardship of Rajshahi University, it offers not just a visit, but a journey through the corridors of history itself.

Rajshahi college

If you set out for Varendra Museum from Zero Point, Rajshahi College will grace your left-hand side just a few hundred meters before your destination.

Shah Makhdum Majar

Less than a kilometer from Zero Point, this majar rises quietly on the serene banks of the mighty Padma. Step outside its mosque, and the river's vast expanse stretches before you. The air here hums with tales of Hazrat Shah Makhdum-legends the locals will eagerly share, each more captivating than the last.

Dhopkols

Visiting the dhopkols is unlike any other excursion in Rajshahi-part treasure hunt, part time travel. Why? Because there are many of them, and they are scattered like forgotten sentinels across the city.

These humble yet ingenious structures are water tanks, built in the early 1900s to deliver pure drinking water to the people of Rajshahi. Once lifelines for the city, they now stand as weathered relics of an era long vanished-silent witnesses to a time when their cool, clean water was nothing short of salvation.

Padma River

The Padma is a vision of beauty no matter where you meet her, but to truly drink in her majesty, head to the T Dam or the I Dam-both offering sweeping, spectacular views of the river in all her glory.

Rajshahi University campus

Like many public university campuses in Bangladesh, Rajshahi University is more than just an academic institution-it is a destination in its own right, deserving a place on your itinerary. Less than five kilometers east of the city's heart, the campus unfolds into a world apart, offering a glimpse into a quieter, more beautiful rhythm of life.
